Entry requirements

Candidates must have acquired <u>both</u> CPCAB's *Level 2 Certificate in Counselling Skills* (CSK-L2) and CPCAB's *Level 3 Certificate in Counselling Studies* (CST-L3) / *Level 3 Certificate in Applied Counselling Studies* (CAST-L3), or their RPL (prior learning) equivalent which must be 150 to 180 GLH (Guided Learning Hours).

Additional information

The total notional learning hours equals 1200 which includes;

- 420 GLH (training centre based hours),
- 440 hours of self directed study e.g. reading, self development exercises, journal work,
- 100 hours client work (work place based),
- 110 hours learning time associated with client work e.g. research, preparation & post-session, case reviews,
- 105 hours learning time for assignments e.g. self reviews, case studies,
- 15 hours clinical supervision,
- 10 hours minimum of personal therapy.

The qualification has been rated at 120 credits.
