Purpose Statement

This qualification is designed to give qualified counsellors the additional skills and proficiencies to work effectively using online and phone mediums. It equips candidates to work in a counselling role offering online and phone therapy in an organisational context or in independent practice.

Candidates studying this qualification must first have completed the two Open University courses below which provide the theoretical basis for this level 5 award:

Online counselling: getting started

And

Online counselling: advancing your knowledge

This qualification will enable successful candidates to work as online and phone counsellors in a range of job and career opportunities, which include but are not limited to:

- An online and phone counsellor in private practice or agency settings.
- The candidate may choose to diversify into the area of teaching counselling (including online delivery) within a FE or HE context providing they hold suitable teaching experience or qualifications.

3. Minimum Assessment Requirements

To achieve the qualification, candidates must be internally assessed as **Proficient** in all 7 learning outcomes of the qualification.

Candidates must give **two** pieces of evidence for each criterion. In addition, the Candidate Learning Record (must include references to all three assessment methods (documents, tutor observation and testimony) across the whole CLR.

5. Candidate Entry Requirements

This qualification is not suitable for those who are currently in a state of severe emotional difficulty and/or severe psychological distress. Centres need to ensure that all potential candidates are made aware of the nature of the course, and in particular that the course involves experiential elements that may involve some personal disclosure. We recommend that tutors carry out an individual interview to ascertain a candidate's suitability for this level of training.

6. Fit for Purpose

This qualification builds upon practitioner level training to provide an additional specialism in working online or on the phone. This section is intended to help learners make informed choices about the qualifications they wish to study and how they will enable them to reach their personal and professional goals.

As a learner continues their journey with the **CPCAB Level 5 Award in Online and Phone Counselling Practice**, they are embarking on post-practitioner training which enables them to work confidently and competently in the field of counselling using online and phone methods of communicating.

CPCAB qualifications are designed to build upon each other, ensuring that the required skills and knowledge are developed alongside the personal growth of the learner. This qualification is based on current research and adheres to the CPCAB's model for practitioner development, ensuring your training meets the highest professional standards.

Learners will receive live teaching in an online classroom, which will include real-time interaction with peers and tutor(s). They will practice what they are learning, receive feedback on their use of skills, and gain insights about themselves through their engagement with others. This live human connection is considered essential when training in an area such as counselling.

The assessment strategy maintains a focus on practitioner skills and qualities as well as on written evidence. The combination of tutor assessment and separate independent verification by CPCAB values both objective independent quality assurance and the relational knowledge of the candidate and their work. A separate external assessment was not considered appropriate for the purpose and length of this qualification. The qualification is reviewed annually to ensure it remains fit for purpose.

Centres have to meet robust centre approval requirements before they can deliver this qualification. All tutors are approved by CPCAB.
